If your level of English is equivalent to the Cambridge Advanced (CAE) or Proficiency (CPE) examinations – Common European Framework Levels C1/C2 - you are invited to attend a Literature and Translation Course on either Friday evenings, from 16.30 to 18.15 or on Tuesday evenings from 17.15 to 19.00, beginning on Friday 11th and Tuesday 15th November 2011, respectively.

The course covers aspects of English not dealt with in our normal evening classes. It provides weekly practice in the skill of translating both fictional and non-fictional texts from German into English, and an opportunity for students to become familiar with, discuss and write essays on the novels, short stories and plays of a variety of writers. The literary theme for the course commencing in autumn 2011 is *'Heroines of English Literature'*

Course-participants are asked to read as preparation the following books – obtainable as a set from our reception, as from June 1<sup>st</sup> 2011- to be discussed in the order given below:

<i>Emma</i>	Jane Austen
<i>South Riding</i>	Winifried Holtby
<i>The Middle-Age of Mrs Elliot</i>	Angus Wilson
<i>I Capture the Castle</i>	Dodie Smith
<i>Georgy Girl</i>	Margaret Forster
<i>The Stone Diaries</i>	Carol Shields

The course will be held on 24 evenings between November 2011 and June 2012. Four course-evenings will be devoted to each of the above titles. It will be assumed that the course participant will have read each of the books by the first of the respective course evenings. Philip Moore will be your course-leader.

The course fee, which is payable by the first course-evening, is € 530,-. The above set of books costs € 60,-.

As the size of each group is limited, prompt enrolment is recommended.
